In my role BCS sub editor, I condense complex evidence into concise, practical summaries for general cardiologists.

I am enthusiastic about digital health and its potential to improve cardiovascular care. I have secured a competitive Department for the Economy Northern Ireland grant to undertake a PGCert in software programming, and next year I will begin an OOPR at King's College London with digital health innovation as a key component.
